I have noticed on my last few outings that the ramp at Government Bay will soon be unusable. The lake level is dropping fast and it has been said that we can expect to set a new all time low water level each day until spring. This is scary. Please pay attention to this as we move through winter and support those that will need your help as they try to save some of our water. The lake is currently at about 1813.3 and they predict the level to be down eight feet from that by the end of winter. Pray for lots of snow.

The cooler summer was not what a lot of folks enjoyed but I feel it was a blessing. The cooler weather did help our cold-water species. I've heard this fact stated from a couple different biologist. They have also added that if we would have had a real hot spell this summer it would have been very stressful on the salmon. As it was the cooler summer the lake did not warm up as expected. Some have commented that the fish did not bunch up on the east end near the dam as they normally do in August.

This year's derby found a few less entrants and lower water but did not lack in enthusiasm. Held on Lake Sakakawea August 28th we had 62 teams competing for trophies and cash. The winds stayed calm and conditions were much better than last year when we called the derby before the start and placements were made by a drawing. Ironically last years Hard Luck winners came in first place this year.

The Youth division had four entrants and we were able to award three placements in that division for kids 13 to 17 years old.

We had 14 entrants in the Fish On Kid / Pass it On division for kids 12 and under. This division is in its second year in memory of Gaylord Johnson and has been a great success. The Johnson family has provided medals for each entrant and the memorial fund provides a fishing rod and reel for them to enjoy fishing after our event.

There were 152 Salmon caught with an average weight of 4.46 pounds. The largest salmon caught was 8-2 pounds. The fishery has survived another year of drought conditions but the size of our catch has definitely been reduced.






2004 SPAWNING EFFORTS —

The ND Game and Fish Department fisheries personnel have the salmon ladder set up on the main boat ramp at Lake Sakakawea State Park. Because of low water levels, the traditional locations in Rodeo (Scoria) Bay are not suitable for the spawning ladder use. The spawning ladder is a 60 foot long, four foot diameter culvert containing a series of baffles. The baffles create pools (steps) where salmon stage or rest as they swim to the top of the ladder. The ladder is set up perpendicular to the shoreline and is typically supplied with water 24 hours a day while the salmon are spawning. The spawning ladder simulates a flowing stream thereby attracting spawning fish.

Chinook salmon begin their spawning run in early October. Since salmon cannot naturally reproduce in the lake, the Game and Fish and Garrison Dam National Fish Hatchery personnel collect and fertilize eggs and transport them to the hatchery. Once the eggs hatch, young salmon spend several months in the hatchery before they are stocked in Lake Sakakawea in the spring. Total salmon spawned as of October 8, was 666, with the egg count at 320,801.
